

What is the BoA?

CPA Ontario's Board of Ambassadors (BoA) is comprised of top undergraduate students from campuses across Ontario. They act as an advisory and advocacy group and are responsible for running events, attending meetings, and promoting the Post-Secondary Ambassador Program (PSAP) and CPA profession to students.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Commit at least 20 hours per month and attend scheduled CPA Ontario meetings throughout the year.
- Promote CPA Ontario initiatives (including the Post-Secondary Ambassador Program) through social media, class announcements, and other platforms.
- Plan, execute, and attend CPA Ontario events both regionally and on campus, including assisting with room bookings and office hours.
- Recruit and manage future Board of Ambassadors representatives and hire a CPA Ontario campus team.
- Serve as a liaison between CPA Ontario and your campus, ensuring engagement and visibility of programs.



Who is a BoA Representative?

Key BoA Characteristics:

- Enjoys interacting with students, faculty and staff on campus
- Demonstrates effective leadership skills, strong communication and public speaking skills
- Is self-motivated and takes initiative
- Exhibits professional judgment
- Can effectively promote, plan, and execute events

Selection Criteria:

To be considered for the BoA position all student applicants must:

- have a strong interest in pursuing the CPA designation
- be a full-time university or college student
- have a minimum 70% average

*PSAP membership is an asset
